## **Preface**

The conduct of Annual School Census (ASC) in Kaduna State Ministry of Education conducted its first ever Annual School Census, following the decision reached at the 54<sup>th</sup> National Council on Education (NCE) in 2007.

The findings marked the continuing of an authentic source of information on the status of education in Kaduna State. It serves as a major tool for providing information to assess progress in the implementation of our Education Sector Plan (ESP) using a set of monitoring indicators.

In addition, it also serves as a reference document for proper planning and budgeting for the education sector, particularly the Medium Term Sector Strategy (MTSS).

In continuation of this process, and as a way of institutionalizing the Education Management and Information System (EMIS), the 2013/2014 ASC was conducted to update the existing information.

The conduct of the 2013/2014 ASC was financed by the SMoE. The DFID-funded Education Sector Support Program in Nigeria (ESSPIN) supported the training of the Enumerators as well as the sensitization of the Education Secretaries on the need to support the conduct of a credible census.

I wish to congratulate the Education Management and Information System Unit of the Department of Planning, Research and Statistics in the SMoE,

Our special thanks go to our development partners, particularly ESSPIN and SESP, for their continuous technical and financial support for the implementation of reform programmes in the education sector.

It is my sincere hope that the information supplied in this report will go a long way in providing for stakeholders the authentic data for planning and decision making.

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## **Definitions**

### **Dropout Rate by Grade**

Dropout rate is the percentage of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year that is no longer enrolled in the following school year. It measures the phenomenon of pupils from a cohort LGA leaving school without completion, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

### **Gross Enrolment Rate (GER)**

GER is the total enrolment in primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the eligible official school-age population (6-11 years in Nigeria). It shows the general level of participation in primary education. It indicates the capacity of the education system to enrol students of that age group. It can also be a complementary indicator to net enrolment rate by indicating the extent of over-aged and under-aged enrolment.

### **Gross Intake Rate (GIR)**

GIR is the total number of new entrants in the first grade of primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population at the official primary school-entrance age (6 years in Nigeria). It indicates the general level of access to primary education. It also indicates the capacity of the education system to provide access to grade 1 for the official school-entrance age population.

### **Net Enrolment Rate (NER)**

NER is the enrolment of the official age group for primary education (6-11 years in Nigeria) expressed as a percentage of the corresponding population. It shows the extent of coverage in a given level of education of children and youths belonging to the official age group corresponding to the given level of education.

### **Pupil-Teacher Ratio (PTR)**

PTR is the average number of pupils (students) per teacher at a specific level of education in a given school year. It measure the level of human resources input in terms of the number of teachers in relation to the size of the pupil population. The results can be compared with established national norms on the number of pupils per teacher.

### **Repetition rate by grade:**

Repetition rate is the percentage of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year who study in the same grade in the following school year. It measures the rate at which pupils from a cohort repeat a grade, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

## **1. Background**

In compliance to The *Nigeria Educational Management Information System Policy*, which was approved by the 54th National Council on Education meeting in Katsina in December 2007, Kaduna State established a fully functional Educational Management and Information System unit in the Department of Planning, Research and Statistics. According to the *Policy*, the National EMIS Committee is responsible, among others, for:

- Ensuring that EMIS is operational and understood uniformly around the country
- Facilitating the sharing of technical information and practices regularly to all institutions that provide primary data for the management of education at any level
- Developing and monitoring compliance with EMIS policies and updating practice
- Clarifying information needs at all levels of the education system and encouraging the flow of data and the training of participants
- Evaluating the performance of the system and recommending actions

In August 2009, the National EMIS Committee approved the ASC Operational Manual, which is based on a census cycle that runs from August to July and also approved a simplified ASC questionnaire for the process. Mid-November was selected as the period for data collection.

The purpose of the school census is to provide yearly data to effectively monitor the state of the education sector and facilitate the use of information for planning and budgeting decisions. This unit has been responsible for the production of the State Annual School Census.

## **Executive Summary**

The 2013/2014 Annual School Census (ASC) was successfully conducted. Data from Public and Private Pre-primary, Primary, Junior and Senior SECONDARY Schools was collected, collated, cleaned and analysed. There were no major challenges in the process.

The main areas covered by the ASC report for both Public and Private Schools include:

- Pupils'/Students' enrolment by gender;
- Teachers' statistics by gender;
- Pupil/Student Teacher ratio by qualifications and gender ;
- Infrastructure in Schools; and
- Other information.

The exercise achieved great level of cooperation with 99% response among Public Pre-primary and Primary Schools, 99% for Junior Secondary Schools, 98% for Senior Secondary, 83% for Science and Technical and 89% for Private Schools.

Enrolment slightly increased in private Pre-Primary, Primary, JSS and SSS schools by 12.7%, 8.5%, 7.9% and 8.4% respectively and the public JSS, and SSS by 36.2% and 47.3% respectively, while slightly decreased in Pre-Primary and Primary by 2.8% and 2.4% respectively.

The report on teachers Statistics shows that the percentage of qualified teachers from 2012/2013 and 2013/2014 remains at 64% in Public Primary Schools; while there is a decrease from 90% to 87% and 90% to 83% in the same period in Public Junior and Senior Secondary Schools respectively the likely reasons for this drop could be attributed to sifting of teachers without teaching qualification, retirement, transfer of service and death.

The number of Pupils/ Students per classroom (Pupil- Classroom ratio) has improved from 70:1, 53:1 and 48:1 students to 54:1, 44:1 and 37:1 students in primary, Junior and Senior Secondary Schools respectively. While that of Private schools at all levels improved from 28:1 to 26:1 pupils per classroom. As in the previous year, there is remarkable improvement in the provision of some facilities such as water and sanitation, furniture and health facilities at all levels.

## 2. School Lists and ASC Coverage

The 2013/2014 ASC process started with the consolidation of the various school lists. This process, like the previous one, also involved the LGAs and parastatals in various iterations. These efforts resulted in a single school list comprehensive of all sectors (public and private) and levels (pre-primary and primary, JSS and SSS). However, after data collection it was discovered, as in the previous case, that several schools were captured that were not in the consolidated school list, while some schools in the list were not captured, at least not with the same name.

Table 2.1 provides the details of the number of schools captured by level.




Figure 1: Kaduna: Public and Private Enrolment by Gender and Level






Figure 3: Kaduna Teachers by Grade Taught, Gender and Qualification Status

Ranked Pupil Qualified-Teacher Ratio




Figure 4: Kaduna Ranked Pupil /Qualified Teacher Ratio (Primary) by LGA




Figure 5: Kaduna: Percentage Classroom Functions by Level and Use by LGA

Figure 6: Kaduna: Primary Pupil Toilet Ratio Ranked by LGA (Lowest Best)







**ENROLMENT IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS**


Primary Enrolment Ratio
